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Case Studies at BC Cancer

Case Studies that fall within the following parameters are exempt from REB review:

Generally, case studies do not require REB approval as they do not fall within the definition of research as described in the Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans – TCPS 2.

Specifically, case reports involving three or fewer participants will be exempt from REB review per TCPS 2, Chapter 2 as research is 'defined as an undertaking intended to extend knowledge through a disciplined inquiry and/or systematic investigation.' Case reports usually are unique accounts of individual cases noted during regular practice. These reports are not initiated as inquiry/investigation, nor are they meant to be generalizable.

Key Considerations:

- 1. Three or fewer participants are involved;
- The case report(s) cannot be used to answer a research question. There can be no intent to conduct research, answer a research question/hypothesis from the outset of case report;
- 3. Results cannot be generalized, and no statistical analysis should be performed;
- 4. Identifiable information and personal information/Personal Health Information (PHI) being used is VERY limited (e.g., age, gender) and coded (i.e. Use partial date of birth/date of death). Information must be coded to ensure individuals cannot be easily re-identified when used in combination.
- 5. Consent from the individuals to whom the information is derived must be considered. This can be verbal consent but should be documented.
- 6. There should be no intention to test various therapies/treatments/interventions prospectively or retrospectively.

Case reports not meeting the above criteria should be considered for REB approval. For further information or if in doubt about a specific project, please contact the BC Cancer Research Ethics Office (reb@bccancer.bc.ca).
